Gossip, Confession, and God's Mercy

Sometimes people come to confession and aren't sure what to confess. I know that might sound strange, but it's true. It can make the job of the priest more difficult, but I can usually just ask a few questions to prod them and that helps them remember some sin to confess. One problematic activity that people sometimes forget about is gossip.

Here's what the Holy Father said on November 7 at a Mass with superiors of religious orders. "Please," he told the superiors, "don't let the terrorism of gossip exist among you. Throw it out. Let there be fraternity. And if you have something against your brother, tell him to his face."

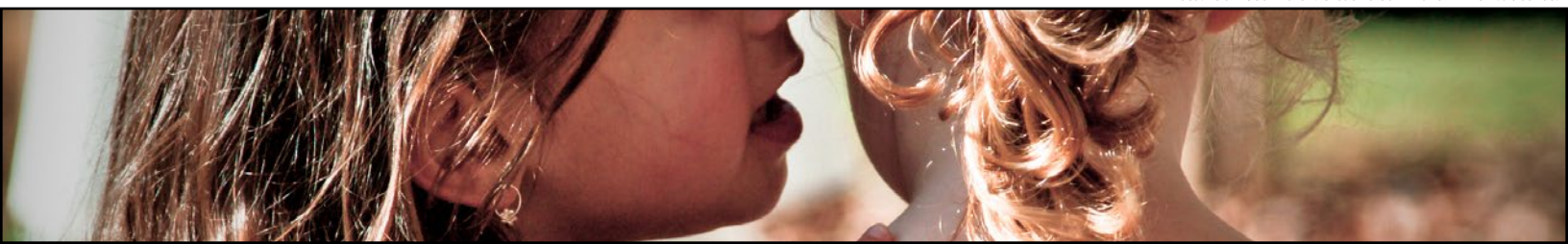
"Sometimes it might end in fisticuffs," he said, causing the superiors to laugh. "That's not a problem. It's always better than the terrorism of gossip." The Pope chose the word terrorism when describing gossip. I had never heard it described that way before, but it is an apt description in my opinion. Gossip can destroy lives just like a physical weapon does. It can make people feel less than human and in a parish gossip can be more problematic than even a boring homily. It can undo a parish, it can make it a toxic place and that's the last thing we need in any parish setting.

I write this not because I think we have this problem, but because gossip can creep into our lives and is something we should try and stamp out wherever we find it. The act of gossip is something to confess if we engage in it and frankly if we confess it I think that helps us in many ways. Sin is real and if we try to convince ourselves that it isn't then we commit another sin, by placing ourselves above God, thus breaking the first commandment. I don't want a parish of people who walk around glumly and wearing ash and sackcloth, but I also don't want to be part of a parish that has an unrealistic view of human nature. We sin, folks, we all do from the little second graders up to the young at heart and it is up to us to realize that placing ourselves before God, and humbly asking His forgiveness isn't a sign of weakness but really a sign of strength; A strength of faith that is so strong that we can place our egos to the side and realize that we are small and God is endless, that God deserves our love, gratitude and our whole heart.

We must strike a balance between His mercy and His judgment. We must honor God by knowing how we must relate to Him. God loves us but he also knows we are weak and that is why He gave us the sacraments. If we cannot place ourselves before the Lord of Love and ask for His mercy we are destined for trouble. Our relationship with God is a two-way relationship that requires us to give and take, to love and be loved. A mature relationship with God is a call and response. It's about listening and talking.

How's your relationship with God? Pray about it and listen to what He has to say to you. Peace and God Bless.

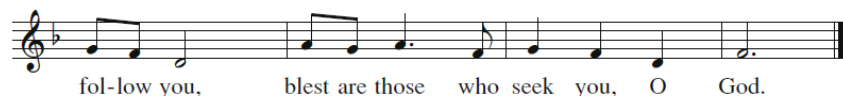
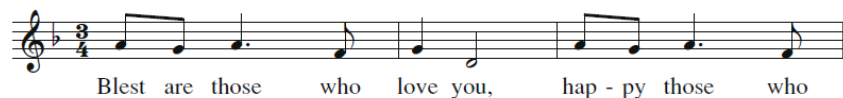

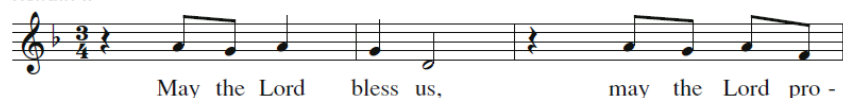
